## SKI ASHLAND WANTS TO DOUBLE THE SIZE OF THEIR SKI AREA IN ASHLAND'S MUNICIPAL WATERSHED

**DRY YEARS:** Ski Ashland has economically failed three times because of dry years. In the sixties it was bailed out by a county bond, the development went bankrupt in the seventies, and a major fund raising event bailed them out in the nineties.

**HYDROLOGY:** Water is trapped by the bowl at the top of the mountain, travels through underground tubes and is released through various springs that are throughout the proposed development area. Runs are proposed to cut directly across streams, underground tubes and flowing springs; this extremely sensitive area should never be disturbed.

**SOILS:** The Ashland Creek watershed has a long history of serious problems due to sediment delivery to the streambed and our drinking water reservoir. This is well documented and has been extremely costly to Ashland taxpayers.

**FLOOD:** The 1964, 1974, and 1997 flood events all had catastrophic effects on both our drinking water reservoir and our historic downtown due to sediment delivery. Linear clear-cut ski runs in the watershed will increase the speed and potential for rapid runoff and soil delivery during a flood event.

**WILDLIFE HABITAT:** The entire development area is pristine old growth habitat.

**RARE PLANTS:** Henderson's Horkelia, Mt. Ashland Lupine, and Engelman Spruce.

**CITY RESPONSIBILITY:** The City does have power over any management proposal in the watershed under a 1929 agreement with the Forest Service.

## Get your comments in to the Forest Service by October 23rd

**COMMENTS:** In all comments, first and foremost demand that any decision is deferred until conditions on the current development are thoroughly addressed. There are many areas with water bars rotting and collapsing, deep gutted channels and bare soils with active sheet flow erosion. Connecting a cleanup project to the expansion decision is unacceptable; cleanup must be completed first. If endorsing an alternative, Alternative 5 can substantially increase both beginner and intermediate terrain in a way that is financially and environmentally responsible. Please endorse alternative 5 only with the following changes:

1. Remove the Moraine lodge.
2. Remove the costly LC-13 lift.
3. Remove extended night lights.
4. Address parking through the use of a shuttle, not extensive parking lot expansion.
